

Approximately 85% of patient records have been switched to electronic record keeping through Healthe WV. This provides greater accuracy with prescriptions and diagnoses as well as cutting down on paper usage. Healthe WV continues to improve and upgrade its programming. Our staff continues with trainings on the upgrades.



HLHL has recently partnerned with the MU Kinesiology Department. We have several volunteers monitoring the fitness area, as well as performing the fit tests. We are every excited about this parntership

and know that with their expertise we will move forward with our exercise component.

We will also be forming a research board to conduct different research throughout our community and most importantly our patients.

The Dental Clinic has stayed very busy since it reopened in July. The clinic is currently open three days a week with volunteer dentists in the office at least two of those days.
